MANKATO

The 2471 Mankato Walmart Distribution Center project in Mankato, MN, began on April 8, 2024, and is slated for completion in Fall 2026. With 60% of the project completed and 30% in change orders, the team has faced significant challenges, including winter weather impacting operations with frozen sand and difficult foundation excavation. The crew continues to persevere through demanding conditions such as low light and short days, showing remarkable adaptability despite design changes and utility challenges on the private site.

Key milestones include importing 620,000 tons of sand and aggregate, exporting 340,000 cubic yards, and installing 4,000 linear feet of storm drains along with 1,000 linear feet of roof drains. These accomplishments are a testament to the hard work and coordination of the team, led by Superintendent Troy Prochaska, who has been instrumental in keeping everyone informed, focused, and productive.

Greg "Pines" Reiland, Laborer, brings unwavering enthusiasm to every task, inspiring those around him. Steve Whipps, Foreman, has expertly managed all trucking operations while leading GPS excavator operations and fieldwork, ensuring precision and efficiency in every step. HAUGEN


The Haugen project, located on Hwy 53 north and south of Haugen, WI, successfully reached completion with the roadway opening on November 15, 2024. The project, spanning 16 miles of both northbound and southbound lanes, began on April 8, 2024, and faced minimal weather challenges despite a wet spring.
